Sports buffs who dwell on nostalgia will love to play Game Time.

The object of Game Time is to acquire as many sports titles as possible and collect a fee when opposing player lands on one of the acquired sports. Baseball, Football, Basketball and Soccer on four sides.

Electronically each player throws the dice and the one with the highest number goes first. They roll the dice and move that many spaces and land on said sport. If able to answer two of the related questions asked by player to the right, title is free of charge, if not answered correctly sport may be purchased for \$400. Each title purchased following a wrong answer increases \$200, thus, the second sport purchased after a wrong answer costs \$600, the third, \$800 and the fourth \$1000. For each correct answer, player may select a position and name a player of that sport on same team, ie., Tom Seaver, pitcher, Daryl Strawberry, right field, Keith Hernandez, first base, 1986 New York Mets, etc. For each correct name and position, \$500 is awarded. When giving the name of players of all nine positions on a baseball team, player is awarded \$3000, if he can name all nine players on the same baseball team even in different years, \$5000 is awarded; These awards are applicable by also giving the names and position of five or more players in basketball, 11 in football and soccer; In golf and tennis the player must name five players from same year. Players may trade or sell pros and swap titles.

There is a board with one space per sport listed individually on the four sides of the board. Thus, the sport is on four different sides. The game is started from the first square, PLAY BALL. When players go around the board and pass PLAY BALL, they are given \$300. Below, in the opposite corner is OVERTIME, when landed upon, player is given a \$100. The following square, to the right is FOUL if landed upon, player forfeits \$200. The opposite square is GAME CALLED and player loses a \$100.

Players are given \$5,000 in \$100 denominations to start game.

When opponent lands on one sport that is owned, the fee is \$200, two of same sport, \$400, three of same sport, \$600 and four of same sport \$1000. Player may reduce fine in half if able to answer two sports related question selected and asked by owner of said sport. Players may trade, sell players or swap sport titles for a fee.

When, there are no more sport titles to be had, the game is over after one hour time limit has elapsed. Player that has most money wins.

BASEBALL: Who hit the most home runs? Who has the most hits? Who won the most World Series? Who pitched the most no hitters? Who has the most wins pitching? The most steals. Who has the most singles, doubles and triples? Who has the most switch hits, etc.

FOOTBALL: Who has the most yards rushing? Who won the 1968 Super Bowl? Who has the most yards throwing? Who has the most Super Bowl titles? Who has the most tackles? Who won the most MVPs? Who has the most yards throwing left handed? Etc.

BASKETBALL: Who won the most titles? Who scored the most points in a game? Who has the most assists in a career? Who has the most points in a career? Who has the most steals? Etc.

SOCCER: Who scored the most goals in a season? Who scored the most goals in a career? Who won the most titles? Who has the most assists? Who won the MVPs? Etc.

GOLF: Who won the most titles? Who won the most money in a season? Who won the most money in a career? Who shot the most sub-par rounds? When was golf first played? Etc.

TENNIS: Where was Tennis first played? Who holds the most titles? Who won the most money in a season? Who won the most money in a career? Who was the oldest person to win a title?
